Context

Perinatal Mental Health Network Scotland (PMHNS) was set up in 2017 to address inequalities across Scotland

September 2017 - Infant mental health Lead appointed February 2019, Curricular Framework for Perinatal (Maternal and Infant) Mental Health with NHS Education Scotland (2019).


March 2019, 'Delivering Effective Services' (Scottish Government, 2019a) was published

Context

'Implement and fund a Scotland wide model of infant mental health provision. These infant mental health services aim to meet the needs of families experiencing significant adversity, including infant developmental difficulties, parental mental illness, parental substance misuse, domestic abuse and trauma.' (Scottish Government, 2019b)

- Perinatal and IMH Programme Board April 2019 investment of £50million over 4 years
- Second wave of funding Greater Glasgow and Clyde

Specialist Intervention – where indicated by care plan


Education – raising awareness of IMH with families and professionals

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
