An incoming Labour government must revive the 1997 spirit of Sure Start and put babies at the heart of policies if it is to achieve its goals, a coalition of charities has said.

The **First 1001 Days Movement**, a coalition of more than 200 charities and professionals, said a five-year decline in toddler development was a "a ticking timebomb" for the UK, and called for vulnerable babies and their families to be seen as "mission critical".

# Covid generation facing developmental time bomb

Charities say urgent action is needed to help children who missed early health checks



By two years of age one in five toddlers is behind in their expected milestones, say experts

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A coalition of more than 200 charities and health professionals have said that the decline in development among children born during the pandemic is a "ticking time bomb" as they called for urgent action to help those affected by the disruption.

## What's next?

Despite the positive 'noises', neither party has committed funding to Start for Life beyond 1 April 2025

Although we have seen the number of Teams growing, we estimate 400 Teams are needed in England alone, to deliver the government's vision

Although we wrote to the Chancellor calling for £67.3 million of additional funding from 2025/26-2027/28 to allow every local authority area to develop at least one parent-infant team, we've not had a reply



#### **Next steps**

- $\circ~$  We need politicians to understand what's at stake
- At least 1 in 10 babies in the UK experiences fear and distress because of disturbed or unpredictable care.
